

MANA POOLS NYAMEPI CLINIC REPAIRED

THE ZAMBEZI SOCIETY – March 2021

During heavy rains at the beginning of December 2020, a waterlogged Natal Mahogany tree collapsed onto the roof of the Clinic at Nyamepi Station, the HQ of Mana Pools National Park. Fortunately only one side of the building was affected (so clinic activities were able to continue), but repairs were needed to the roof and a couple of walls.



The Zambezi Society was quickly able to assess the damage on site, and thanks to donations we had recently received from Steve Bolnick of [Camp Mana](#) and the [Zambezi Elephant Fund](#), we were able to source repair materials in Harare while waiting for the rainy season to subside.

In mid-March, our Project Supervisor (Operations), Mitch Riley and Builder, Moses Dzepasi, transported everything to Mana Pools and set about the repair.





The job was completed in 2 days at a total cost of US\$900!

The Mana Pools Clinic provides a crucial service to the ZimParks rangers and their families. The Zambezi Society makes regular deliveries of medical supplies to the station, for use in the clinic, whenever they are required (and provided we have the funding available).
